- Employment specialist; will pay for training of employee in the first few weeks
- Soft skills workshop; they want someone who can get along (team oriented) over hard skills
- After graduate 21 days; Assist with purchasing a car (\$2000) and car repairs
- Employment rate 65%; completion rate 60%
- Amanda Southerland Service Center; program for dislocated workers; training for retraining if job ends; youth training/schooling; not a staffing agency but a resource center. Computer lab open 8am-5pm. Workshops also provided. All services are free.
- Help folks get a job and keep a job.
- Sharlee Coffman-Cook, Fair Housing Center of Southwest Michigan
  - Annual Conference May 4<sup>th</sup>
  - Equal access to housing; not limiting housing choices to a protected class
  - Civil Rights Act
  - Slide show presentation handed out
  - Large pop is disabled
  - Service animal vs. emotional support animal (not a pet); can facilitate
    - Reasonableness and not a blanket decision
  - Verbage changing in the mission statement; policy changing around deadlines for Cities re City Plans; guided by Fed law an act of Congress; can't overhaul the program.
  - Discussion of new rule; setting goals may not be reasonable to achieve another unfounded mandate. Date due in 2020.
